Henry Award and the National Book Critics Circle Award, as well as the Library of Congress Prize for American Fiction, Louise Erdrich also penned this novel for readers 9 and up about a stout-hearted, intuitive Ojibwa girl living on an island in Lake Superior in 1847. Omakayas (or Little Frog, so named because her first step was a hop) turns "eight winters old" during the course of this four-season novel, and discovers she has a special ability that may make her a healer. Erdrich, a member of the Turtle Mountain Band of Ojibwa, studied the history of this time from oral and archival sources, and illustrates the tale with her own pencil drawings. 244.
