




No Hands to Hold & No Legs to Dance on: A Thalidomide Survivor's Story

As she was photographed with her family and appeared on television meeting celebrities during the battle, few people realised that she did not live with her wealthy parents and three siblings at their spacious North London home but was being brought up in an institution, Chailey Heritage in Sussex.
